The Gospel today brings to us something important: faithfulness in small matters is how we practice our readiness to be faithful in greater matters.

As athletes prepare through consistent training, we grow in virtue through the discipline of consistent practice, whenever the opportunity arises. Small moral choices may not seem to matter, but they do. They are an opportunity to develop our resilience.

While the servants in today's Gospel deal with their master's money only for a limited time, we are responsible for our gifts for the entirety of our lives. There is some reassurance here, practicing trustworthiness in small ways prepares us for the great joy that God promises.

The servant who received only one talent "plays it safe" and buries it in the ground. And then wants to give it back! Maybe he didn't want to receive it in the first place. It is hardly likely that he, or we, are going to make a worthy investment of our gifts, if we haven't really been willing to receive them in the first place! Perhaps the greater risk is opening ourselves up to what God wants to give

Across the Path - from the School Principal, Daniel Pepper:

Food Festival A big thank you to those parishioners who managed to come along to our Food Festival. It was a great evening and really showcased the diverse community we have here in the Bay. All money raised on the night goes towards our school's Foundation.

School Strategic Plan Currently the school is writing the plan for the next two years. This will set the direction of where we want our school to go. As part of our plan, we will be looking at the following three aspects.

- 1) Special Character we will be writing a schoolwide faith learning pathway to support new families to our school so that they feel informed about the many different aspects of belonging to a Catholic community.
- 2) Learning we will be reviewing and updating our literacy plans here at school, with a special focus on structured literacy and our middle school.
- 3) Treaty of Waitangi creating a learning plan that unpacks the local area and allows the children to understand the importance of Blockhouse Bay, not only with the local tangata whenua, but also the historical aspects of this area.

Mihi Whakatau Last week we welcomed another five children to our school. We formally welcome all new families into our school with a Mihi Whakatau, a special celebration which shows that not only the children are valued, but also their families.
