God's chosen today

Mark 1:12-15 The temptation of Jesus in the desert.

1st Sunday of Lent

18 February 2024



'[Jesus] shared our human nature in all things but sin' (Fourth Eucharistic Prayer). Expanding this affirmation, the Epistle to the Hebrews states, that, in Jesus, 'we have one who in every respect has been tested as we are, yet without sin' (Hebrews 4:15) - a truth graphically illustrated in the Gospel accounts of Jesus' confrontation with Satan during the forty days he spent in the wilderness before proclaiming his mission.

'The time is fulfilled,' he said to the Galileans, 'and the kingdom of God has come near; repent, and believe in the good news.' Though this kingdom 'is not from this world' (John 18:36), as Jesus assured Pontius Pilate, it is 'among us' here and now (Luke 17:21).

The beginning of Lent is a good time to reflect on these texts. Paul's advice is: 'Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God - what is good and acceptable and perfect' (Romans 12:2).

Ash Wednesday: It was great to be able to celebrate Ash Wednesday in our school hall with the parishioners. As we start the season of Lent, children have been learning all about what this means for them and how they can use this time to grow and reflect in their faith.

New Religious Education Curriculum: Our Year 1 and 2 students are being taken through the religious education programme for the first time this year. CHURCH RENOVATION UPDATE.

The renovation project current update is that the Asbestos removal is complete. The subsequent clean-up has also been done. The final certification has been completed and cleared. The preliminary electrical work has started, mainly to install the new lighting and wiring for the sound system.

There is some remedial building work to be done post asbestos removal, which will be carried out once approval for the work has been received.

The Church bench frames have been painted and are stored in the containers outside the church. All of the upholstery has also been completed (off site).

The external painting is mostly completed, and the painters will move inside the church, once the electrical and building preparation work is done. All external scaffolding will be dismantled over the next few days.

Due to unforeseen circumstances and extra repair work required the project will be delayed. Further updates will follow.
