PALM SUNDAY OF THE LORD'S PASSION TODAY'S SCRIPTURE READINGS

Blessing of Palms: First Gospel: Mark 11:1-10 or Jn 12:12-16

Isaiah 50:4-7 The servant of the Lord did not turn back; he was beaten and spat upon. The suffering one knew that the Lord was with him.

24th March 2024

Are you prepared to hear the Easter story this year? With your disciple's ear ready, shoulders back, and face set like flint, take a deep breath. As you exhale, let go of your own story, all selfishness and pride. Let yourself become little, humble before your God. It might take a few breaths to do this, to really let go of all your ideas, convictions, and plans, no matter how good they are.

Breathe ... Breathe in the love born of covenant peace and breathe out anything hindering your deep listening to the story this year. Give yourself some time. This is an opportunity for you to let the seeds of your Lenten prayer bear fruit.

Now read the Passion Narrative slowly (Mark 14:1—15:47), and in the space that you have cleared in your heart, keep this word firmly, let it live and grow in your whole being as you journey through this Holy Week." ~ God's Word 2024

Making Connections (Between the readings)

The first reading provides the first moment of stark contrast between the procession's triumphant tones and the gravity of the passion. The glory of Jesus's entrance into Jerusalem was not for it's own sake. The beautiful hymn of the second reading captures this paradox in all its fullness: Jesus shares God's being by rights, but by choice humble himself to death. It is this humility that allows his even greater exaltation and the worship we now bring to the one who gives us life.

Across the Path - from the School Principal, Daniel Pepper:

Passover meal: We have a special Passover meal planned for the children on Holy Thursday 28th. We do this every second year with the other year being the Stations of the Cross. This year, because the parish has been using our school hall, we will be having the meal in individual classes. The meal/liturgy will start at 1pm and all children will take part from our new entrants to our seniors. Children will be dressed in Jesus type clothing for this day.

Our 4 school Values: St. Dominic de Guzman, an itinerant preacher and our school and parish name-sake, founded the Order of Preachers in 1216. "Dominicans" as they are known are formed throughout their lives according to the four pillars St. Dominic established –

Prayer, Study, Community and Service.

At St Dominics Catholic Primary School we have 4 school values.

Aroha, Respect, Perseverance and Respect, derived from the 4 pillars of the Dominican order.
