#### SECOND SUNDAY of EASTER (DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY) TODAY'S SCRIPTURE READINGS

Thomas was absent at the first appearance of the risen Jesus to his disciples, but he was the central character in the second appearance which ends with a beatitude forever associated with him: 'Happy are those who have not seen and yet believe'.

Thomas represents future generations of Christians who are called to believe on the testimony of others. At the Last Supper, in his prayer to the Father, Jesus already had them in mind: 'I pray not only for these, but for those also who through their words will believe in me. May they be one. Father, may they be one in us, as you are in me and I am in you' (John 17:20-21). As profound as Thomas' confession was after he came to believe, the faith of those who do not enjoy the kind of experience he and the other disciples had is more remarkable. Peter speaks so beautifully of this faith: 'You did not see him, yet you love him, and still without seeing him, you are already filled with a joy so glorious that it cannot be described, because you believe; and you are sure of the end to which your faith looks forward, that is, the salvation of vour souls' (1 Peter 1:8-9).
